



Transgender Voting FAQ

Question	Answer
<p>Do I have to show ID to vote?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Most Minnesota voters do not have to show ID. • However, if it is your first time voting at your polling place, you will need to show an approved form of ID. • If you are a newly registered voter or have moved since you last voted, be sure to bring ID with you when you vote. • You may also be asked to show ID if you have not voted in the last two elections.
<p>How can I prepare to vote?</p>	<p>Make sure you are registered to vote. Any changes in legal name or address should be reflected on your voter registration before you vote. If you have moved or legally changed your name since the last time you voted, make sure you update your voter registration.</p> <p>Make sure your name is correct on your photo ID. If your ID is not reflective of your current legal name, you should get an updated ID. Examples of permitted photo IDs include: Minnesota driver's license or Minnesota ID card; ID issued by any Commonwealth agency; ID issued by the U.S. Government; U.S. passport; U.S. Armed Forces ID; Student ID. The use of Student ID is limited to students at universities that have submitted the housing list to the county. If you are unsure if your university has done so, contact your university or your county auditor's office.</p> <p>If possible, obtain an updated ID with a current photo. If you no longer resemble the picture on your photo ID, your identity could be challenged at the polling place</p>
<p>How do I vote by mail?</p>	<p>To vote by mail, apply to have a ballot mailed to you. You do not need to be registered to vote to apply. If you have already applied for a ballot, it will be mailed to you as early as September 23rd, 2022.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You may return your ballot by mail or in-person. Your ballot must be returned by the last mail delivery on Election Day, November 8th. • If you chose to return your ballot in-person, it must be received by 3pm on Election Day by your local elections office. • Ballots received after Election Day will NOT be counted.

You have the right to vote in person. Having an ID that doesn't match your gender identity or presentation should not prevent you from voting as long as election officials can identify you from the picture. Gender discrepancies and your choice of clothing or hairstyle are NOT a valid reason to deny a ballot. You do not have to answer questions about your gender identity, gender expression, or transition status.
