



### Voting while in the Hospital or a Nursing Home FAQ

Question	Answer
<p><b>Can I vote while I'm in the hospital or nursing home?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Yes! Local election officials send teams of election judges (poll workers) to nursing homes and hospitals during the 20 days before the election. They hand out ballots to eligible residents of the facility and give help if needed. <p><b>What if the hospital I'm in is not in the city or town where I reside?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The election judges provide ballots only to voters who live in the city or town where the hospital is located. <p><b>How do I deliver my ballot?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- If you are able, you can deliver your absentee ballot by mail, at your early voting location, or in person on <b>Election Day by 3 pm</b>.</li> <li>- If you're unable to return your ballot in the ways aforementioned, you may be eligible for agent delivery, to learn more click here: <a href="https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/register-to-vote/im-in-a-nursing-home-or-hospital/">https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/register-to-vote/im-in-a-nursing-home-or-hospital/</a></li> </ul>
