### HOW TO VOTE

#### **WHO CAN VOTE?**

- To vote in Minnesota, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old on Election Day, and a resident of Minnesota for at least 20 days.
- If you had a felony conviction, you can vote after you finish all parts of your sentence, including any probation, parole, or other conditions such as restitution.
- You can vote while under guardianship unless a judge has revoked your right to vote.

#### **REGISTER TO VOTE**

- You must be registered to vote at your current address. To register or to update your registration, go to [mnvotes.gov](https://mnvotes.gov).
- You can also register at your polling place on Election Day. You must show proof of your name and current address. For more details, visit [mnvotes.gov](https://mnvotes.gov).

#### **VOTE EARLY WITH AN ABSENTEE BALLOT**

You can vote early at your local elections office. You can also apply to have an absentee ballot sent to you in the mail. To find your local elections office or to request an absentee ballot, visit [mnvotes.org](https://mnvotes.org).

#### **WHAT TO BRING ON ELECTION DAY**

If you are registered to vote at your current address, you do not need to bring identification. If you need to register or to update your registration, you will need to show proof of residence before you vote. To learn more, visit [mnvotes.gov](https://mnvotes.gov)

#### **2022 DATES**

##### **VOTE EARLY**

- Vote by mail or in person September 23 through November 7.

##### **ELECTION DAY**

- Tuesday, November 8

- Most polling places are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
